The meeting was called to order at 6:20 p.m.

Chief – Robbery of the Bank of the West recently – Dolly was a witness. A suspect was identified and charged with multiple robberies. We had another robbery at the same location/same teller on Monday.

Door hanger code – there was a recent case with similar circumstances – it was ruled to be non-enforceable. Ray said that we could notify the companies who leave them that we don't appreciate it and don't support them. The Chief will be working with the IACP to come up with an ordinance that will work. There is no way to construct a panhandler code that is enforceable.

There's a cleaning product company with sales people going door-to-door – burglaries have occurred around the same time. If anything seems suspicious – call the police.

The document shredding event is moving forward. A bicycle safety event is an idea for the future, including free helmets, etc. - possibly in conjunction with the walk/bike to school event.

We have a vacation house check service that's done by the cadets/reserves. Just call the business line to let us know.

Tom Garrett is back to work. We've extended a conditional job offer to Jake Heimbigner – he's going through the background process now. We will be hiring two more officers soon.

Ray – introduced the guests.

Ray asked if everyone had reviewed the minutes from the last meeting. Don made a motion to approve the minutes. Mary seconded the motion. Agreed unanimously (Joanne abstained).

Ray – gave an update on the Light Rail project.

Brad – Joanne has some questions regarding traffic calming. Her neighborhood association has concerns regarding speeding vehicles on 22nd and River Road. They would like a list of traffic calming ideas.

Brad – gave an update on the various projects. Joanne asked about the paint on the crosswalks wearing off on McLoughlin in the downtown area. Brad says that falls under ODOT's jurisdiction. Ray said there may be 50 additional kids walking to school next year due to budget cuts.

Susanna – 2010 K9 Walk is July 24th – they will join the parade from Dogwood Park, then continue the walk after the parade. She handed out a copy of the flier for approval. We need to find sponsors for the event. We also need volunteers for various duties. There was a discussion regarding possible sponsors. Joel suggested they contact the Kiwanas for support.

Joanne – found out her term ends June 30th, 2012. Mary said she was re-elected for her term that was supposed to expire in June. Ray was re-elected also.

Mary – environmental hazard area near Railroad/37th/Monroe. The phone number on the sign has been disconnected. She did some research on the situation – creosote was spilled in that area in 1988. She's continuing her research. It may still be an environmental issue.

Joel – the Kiwanas are interested in re-opening a club in Milwaukie. They are a world-wide organization. Their emphasis is on kids, including the Doernbecker cancer program and a camp near Mt. Hood. Each club has their own local projects. They're looking for 20 charter members to create a new club. It costs \$100 to join.
