The meeting was called to order at 6:20 p.m.

Dave asked if everyone had reviewed the minutes from the last meeting. Ray made a motion to approve the minutes. Joanne seconded the motion. Agreed unanimously.

Captain Rash – had info on National Night Out – it's on August 3rd. We will have some fingerprint kits for families.

Personnel issues – we just had Officer Charron graduate from the academy. He will start field training soon. We will hire another of our Reserves for a full time position soon.

Mary said there is graffiti near the Sunny Corner Market on the electrical/utility box there. Dave will pass along the information to Code Enforcement.

Expansion of NTMP Program and Monroe Bike Boulevard – Alex explained the funding and projects. He said they are bringing a resolution before the Council soon that is a pilot program for three years. They want input from the neighborhood associations and PSAC. There is \$47,000 in the budget this year. Joanne said her neighborhood is looking for traffic calming ideas for River Road. Brad said they are working on it and will provide her with a list before their next meeting.

He explained that ODOT has grant money available for the bike boulevard project. They determined that Monroe Street would be the most appropriate location. They're looking for letters of support from community groups. Susanna made a motion to support the project and provide a letter of support. Don seconded the motion. Passed unanimously.

Ray – gave an update on the Light Rail project. There was a discussion regarding crime in the area around the Clackamas Town Center. Mary talked about high speed rail.

K-9 Walk – there was a discussion regarding sponsors, donations, volunteers, etc.

Mary – said there was a Code Red alert for brown water recently. She suggested putting the same message on the City’s website so people could read it there as well. She passed the suggestion onto Pat DuVal.

Mary – received a parking complaint from a downtown business owner – the employees of Reliable Credit are parking on Main Street and continually moving their cars every two hours so his regular customers can’t find a place to park. Mary will email Code Enforcement.

Railroad Avenue speed limit – Brad said ODOT has the study and they have not responded yet.

Mary said she saw a white van recently that said “Clackamas County Volunteer Communications/ham radio” on it.
