The meeting was called to order at 6:20 p.m.

Dave asked if everyone had reviewed the minutes from the last meeting. Pepi made a motion to approve the minutes. Ray seconded the motion. Agreed unanimously.

Chief thanked everyone for the funding of K-9 Jag's new vest. Jag came to the meeting and showed it off. Mary shared some info on insurance for dogs.

Chief said that the Ardenwald neighborhood and the Johnson Creek residential treatment facility have a neighborhood agreement that all the primary parties have agreed upon. The Chief went over the procedures for what the P.D. would do if someone from the facility went missing. There was a discussion regarding the facility.

Chief went over an on-going case involving a minor who was in danger and had been abducted – we put out an Amber Alert. We were able to recover her successfully. Chief has been named as head of the Amber Alert committee by the OACP.

Chief talked about the crime stats and shared the most recent crime map. There was a discussion regarding including domestic violence.

Work Plan – Chief wanted to suggest including something relating to kids/schools. He asked if the PSAC would consider having a youth representative. Everyone was in favor of that.

October 7th there will be a national walk/bike to school event and the Chief will be leading the way to Ardenwald School.

Chief – shared information from the Sheriff on a search and rescue conference. He's offered the use of Jag for search and rescue efforts. He also shared a flyer from a service that provides radar speed signs for private use. He shared information on some training

in Salem in October regarding volunteers in natural disasters. He shared an ad from American Whistle Corporation – they purchase whistles for kids.

Photo red light – now has video. Now that we've ironed out the quality issues in the photo radar system we can now move onto the photo red light program. The speed sign issues on King Road have been resolved.

Proposed amendments to City Code 8.04.160 Notices and advertisements – the guests did not attend the meeting. Dave will come up with a draft for the Council that the code be amended so that door hangers regarding urgent matters (water shut-offs, service notices, etc.) are allowable. Mary would like to include the results of the neighborhood surveys.

Light rail update – Ray said there is a meeting October 5th at Ridge City Church, 28th & Harrison, for the station design for the downtown station (21st & Lake Road) 6:30p.m. There's also a meeting on October 12th at Ardenwald School regarding the Tacoma station.

NTMPSP – Brad asked if anyone had talked to their neighborhood associations to inquire about next year's projects. Kim said that there seem to be speeding issues on 42nd Avenue and speed bumps have been suggested. Mary asked if the things that were on the bottom on the list last year were still a possibility. Brad said they would need to resubmit it if the project is still wanted. There was a discussion regarding a speed study on Railroad Avenue.

Susanna – would like the Foundation help her apply for a mini grant from Clackamas County for give-aways for the kids who participate in the Walk To School event. She's asking the PSAC members to promote the event with their neighborhood associations.
