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
Milwaukie to welcome author Lois Leveen

The Movie Maven Presents: Films for Foodies!



WARNING! Reading this article may result in increased appetite and a desire to flip a pancake. Please have a snack nearby. No matter how different we are in interests and life styles, we all love to eat! Here are some films that celebrate the glory and splendor of a good meal:

Babette's Feast (1987): This film presents a simple story of two Danish sisters who have devoted their lives to the care of their strict and unloving father. Upon his death, they take in a French refugee named Babette. To repay their kindness, Babette cooks a spectacular meal in honor of the 100th anniversary of their father's birth. It proves to be a life changing event.

Chef (2014): Jon Favreau wrote, directed and starred in this tale of a master chef who loses his job after a ranting meltdown aimed at a prominent food critic. He then buys and refits a food truck and travels across the country reconnecting with his creativity and his estranged family.

Jiro Dreams of Sushi (2011): This fascinating documentary tells the

story of 85 year old sushi master Jiro Ono and his relationship with his son, Yoshikazu, the heir to his world renowned Tokyo restaurant.

Julie and Julia (2009): Julie is Julie Powell (Amy Adams), a food blogger. Julia is Julia Child (Meryl Streep), a master of French cooking. As Julie challenges herself to cook every dish in Julia's first cookbook, their stories intertwine as they discover the desire and inspiration that can be found in a pan.

Mostly Martha (2001): Martha Klein is the head chef and undisputed ruler of the kitchen of her German restaurant. Her life is changed drastically when she suddenly becomes the guardian of her headstrong eight year old niece, Lina. Meanwhile, the entrance of a new and unorthodox sous chef at work causes her to question her life choices.

Ratatouille (2007): I usually don't review movies made with a younger audience in mind, but I can't have an article about the passion of cooking without mentioning this delightful

children's film. A Parisian rat with sophisticated culinary tastes longs to be a chef despite the obvious obstacles in his way. He befriends a hapless kitchen worker and the two of them create gastronomic magic. This fun for the whole family film is available in the Children's library.

Bottle Shock (2008): And now for some wine with our meal. This hilarious yet poignant film starring Alan Rickman recounts the early days of the Napa Valley wineries. In 1976, when the only decent wine was thought to come from Paris, a small California vineyard went head to head in a major taste test that changed the industry forever.

Romantics Anonymous (Les Emotifs Anonymes - 2010): How about some dessert! Jean Renee, the owner of a small chocolate factory, hires Angelique, a master chocolatier. Their passion for chocolate helps them overcome their debilitating shyness and love blooms. Chocolate indeed conquers all.
