We are writing to follow up on our September 16 letter and express our continued interest in resuming two-on-two talks between our entities on Milwaukie Bay Park.


The recent wave of community demonstrations and communications further highlight the public's interest in seeing our two agencies work out our differences and come together to make progress on delivering this regional asset. We share a common interest in not jeopardizing future goodwill around public investment in parks. The city remains willing and eager to come to the table as soon as the Board lifts its pause on communications related to this project.

If the Board of Directors is willing to resume two-on-two talks, we feel we have a real opportunity to work through logistical and financial questions and make progress that will meet the needs of both parties. The City of Milwaukie is willing to discuss what financial assurances would make NCPRD feel comfortable restarting the project.


As stated in our previous communications, it is our view that the validation petition currently under consideration by the court of appeals is not related to the Milwaukie Bay Park project, but rather an important step for fully understanding the meaning of the existing intergovernmental agreement between the city and NCPRD. Nothing precludes our agencies from making progress on Milwaukie Bay Park while these legal proceedings continue.
