To purchase meals for Milwaukie Police Department personnel and three guests of the award winners at the dinner. The amount requested will partly cover the cost of 5 meals. Milwaukie Public Safety Foundation will cover all remaining costs, including part of the cost of general tickets to the dinner. Total number of tickets given to the police department is 4 to each award winner, and 20 to be distrubuted in the department. That is a total of 32, eight more than previous years as there are 3 years of awards.
