# February NDA Notes - Police

- On January 24<sup>th</sup> we ran a multi-agency traffic mission in Milwaukie with approximately 15 traffic officers from multiple jurisdictions. These 15 officers made 160 traffic stops, issued 208 citations, gave 84 warnings, and made 3 arrests (one warrant, one 3<sup>rd</sup> cell phone violation arrest, and one fail to carry and present arrest).
- Officer Tim Cleary has been released from field training and is now on his own. This is an exceptionally long process. From interview, to background, to hiring, basic police academy, and then a roughly 3-4 month FTEP. This all equates to about 16 months of work to be able to be released onto his own for solo status. Well done Ofc. Cleary!
- On 1/28/24 at about 9:30 am, officers responded to the intersection of SE Monroe and Wood Avenue on the report of a person struck by a vehicle on the roadway. Officers arrived along with medical personnel and located a 67-year-old female who was conscious and suffering from substantial injuries. The driver of the vehicle remained at the scene and after an initial investigation, was arrested for DUII. The driver of the suspect vehicle, Kristin Russell, 57, of Milwaukie, was booked at the CCJ for DUI, Assault II, and Vehicular Assault of a Pedestrian.
- On January 26<sup>th</sup>, Chief Strait and Captain Burdick went to the North Clackamas Chamber of Commerce meeting for the 7<sup>th</sup> annual women in leadership and management awards. During this event, Milwaukie's own Wilda Parks received a "Lifetime Achievement Award" for years of volunteer work and her many contributions to the community and City of Milwaukie. Wilda has a lifetime of working for the public good and we are so proud of her.

Milwaukie, OR - On 1/24/24 approximately 2:00 AM, Milwaukie
Officers were onscene of a trespassing person near the 11500 Block
of SE Linwood Ave. A resident had reported an unknown individual in
their backyard. Officers set up a perimeter and located the suspect
with the assistance of a thermal camera equipped drone and took
them into custody without incident.

During the search, an Officer parked a marked patrol vehicle in the Northbound lane of travel on SE Linwood Ave. with parking lights and red and blue lights activated alerting motorists to the parked emergency vehicle. Officers escorted the handcuffed suspect to the non-roadway side of the parked patrol vehicle to process them for transport.

An officer noticed a vehicle, identified as a black Chevrolet Camaro, traveling at posted speeds in the Northbound lane of travel on SE Linwood Ave. with no headlights activated. The Officer realized the driver was not slowing down and quickly alerted two other Officers to take hold of the suspect and jump out of the way just prior to the Camaro colliding with the marked patrol vehicle. No occupants were inside the patrol vehicle, no injuries were sustained.

The original suspect from the trespass was emotionally affected by the incident and unable to care for himself. MPD officers placed him on a Behavioral Health Hold in lieu of arrest. He was transported to a local hospital for treatment.

Clackamas County Sheriff's Office Deputies arrived and assumed the crash investigation. The driver of the Camaro, identified as Jeffery Michael Bertsch, 31, was transported to a local hospital and later released to Clackamas County Deputies and lodged at the Clackamas County jail on charges of DUII, Reckless Driving and four counts of Recklessly Endangering.
