### Oregon SRTS Advisory Committee

This letter has been written to express the strong support of Milwaukie's Lewelling Neighborhood District Association (LNDA) for funding to improve the safety of children walking, rolling or biking to and from Seth Lewelling Elementary School. As Milwaukie's officially sanctioned neighborhood association for this area, the LNDA is vitally interested in the safety of children attending Seth Lewelling Elementary School.

Following the death of a small child (who was killed by a hit-and-run driver on a nearby street that has no sidewalks) members of the LNDA have worked over the last three years to identify ways to improve safety near the school. This led to the receipt of an SRTS grant to prepare a public improvement plan. That plan was completed by Alta Planning/Design in 2023 and is now the central document outlining the needed safety improvements for the area.

Using the criteria established by ODOT and your committee, we feel that our application meets all of the applicable criteria and justifies grant funding for construction. We continue to meet regularly with City Engineering staff and we intend to see this project through to completion. Although Milwaukie's population no longer requires local matching funds for this grant we feel that you should know that this City has already funded over \$3,000,000 of traffic safety improvements in the vicinity of Lewelling Elementary School, with another \$4,000,000 to be spent on King Road in 2025. Clearly, the City is doing it's part and now we need your support to do everything we can to assure the safety of neighborhood children.

Thank you for your work on behalf of school children all over Oregon. We look forward to your support for Milwaukie's application for construction of improvements to implement the Safe Routes to School Plan prepared for Seth Lewelling Elementary School.
