The meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. by Chair Weaver. Introductions were made. One new member; Regis Niggeman, recently elected by the Linwood NDA introduced himself. Also attending were Marti Peterson from M & M marketing group, City of Milwaukie mayor elect Mark Gamba, and City of Milwaukie engineering director Jason Rice.

#### Mark Gamba & Jason Rice

- Pedestrian and Bicycle safety is the City Council's number one goal, with a
  priority given to the areas around our schools. Mayor elect Gamba asked the
  PSAC if they would be willing to take on a large project, including identifying the
  needs of the community, developing a list of projects, and prioritizing them.
- The concept was discussed at length, with a lot of support.
- PSAC will look at changes to their work plan and use the July meeting for a presentation on the TSP.
- City council is also looking for a committee to champion emergency preparedness.

### **Clackamas Fire District #1**

- Battalion Chief David Scheirman reported the bond measure was approved by a 67% majority. He thanked the citizens. The district will soon begin to update their training and maintenance facilities, and also update their air packs.
- The district is working closely with TriMet and Milwaukie PD on emergency training for the new light rail line. They will be participating in a training session on June 12<sup>th</sup>.
- On June 4<sup>th</sup> the American Legion will be hosting an awards dinner for Fire District #1 and give awards to the firefighter and volunteer firefighter of the year.

### Milwaukie Police Department

- The hiring and training process is on going to bring the department up to 100 % staffing.
- The 9K 4 K9 walk will be held on July 11<sup>th</sup>, 9:00 AM at the Milwaukie Market Place.
- Chief Bartol communicated his support for the committee taking on the challenge
  of developing a list of projects, and suggesting priorities for city wide pedestrian
  and bicycle safety improvements.

### Monroe Greenway Project

- Chris reminded us that there will be an open house on Monday June 1, at Grace Point Church. The open house begins at 6:00 PM. Chris will walk any of us who are interested through the recommendations at 6:15.
- Chris mentioned that the one component that was most agreed on by the advisory committee was the bike/ped path east from 42 Ave to Linwood.
- Chris also commented that the process was still in the beginning stages and it
  has not been determined how it will be adopted. The City council will hold a work
  session on the project June 16.
