

Drive Less Save More:
MILWAUKIE

Exploring Milwaukie, Oak Grove,
and beyond



Ride your bike to the Tacoma, Milwaukie, or Park Ave. MAX station!

All locations offer free bike parking at surrounding bike racks. Concerned about arriving to the MAX station and not having a safe place to leave your bike? Let your bicycle enjoy the comforts of a secure, enclosed, bike parking space for a few cents an hour!

How it works:

- ▶ Buy a \$20 keycard online from www.bikelink.org or (888-540-0546). A one-time fee of \$5 is charged to activate your card.
- ▶ Insert your keycard at the door to enter the facility and start the meter.
- ▶ Pay just 3 cents/hour 8 a.m.–8 p.m. on weekdays and 1 cent/hour all other times.
- ▶ Bike & Ride facilities are accessible 24 hours a day with your keycard, and they are monitored by security cameras.
- ▶ Spaces are first-come, first-served!

Bike Parking at **SE Park Ave.** Station:

54 keycard-access bike parking spaces
24 free bike rack spaces

Bike Parking at **Milwaukie Main** Station:

6 keycard-access bike lockers
42 free bike rack spaces

Bike Parking at **Tacoma** Station:

72 keycard-access bike parking spaces
34 free bike rack spaces



Bikes ARE allowed on TriMet buses and MAX

Here are some things to know when riding the bus:

- ▶ Every TriMet bus is equipped with a bike rack on the front that can hold two bikes. Bikes are not allowed inside buses unless they can collapse to the size of a standard piece of luggage.
- ▶ When using a rack, squeeze the handle on the top of the rack and lower it.
- ▶ Place your bike in the rack and place the bar over your front wheel (as close to the frame as possible).
- ▶ When retrieving your bike at your stop, exit through the front door and let the driver know that you have a bike to remove.
- ▶ Remove your bike and fold up the rack if it is empty.

Here are some things to know when riding the MAX:

- ▶ Board only through one of the doors displaying the bike symbol
- ▶ Your bike must be stored in one of the designated areas marked with a bike symbol, located inside the front and rear doors of each MAX car.
- ▶ Bikes are allowed on MAX only if there is room, so if all designated bike spaces are full or the train is too crowded to board safely, you must wait for the next train.
- ▶ Each “low-floor” train car can hold a total of 8 bikes
- ▶ Each “high-floor” train car (those with stairs at the door), can hold 9 bikes - one bike may also be placed against the door of the operator’s cab if the cab is not in use.
