Safe Access for Everyone (SAFE) is the City of Milwaukie's program to improve safety for people walking, biking and more.

Milwaukie is a great place to live, so our city is growing—and that means more traffic.

Preserving safety for kids walking to school, people using wheelchairs, and everyone in between is just the right thing to do, and it's also required by federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) laws.

That's why we're installing, upgrading or replacing portions of sidewalks, ramps and crossings—to fill safety gaps and remove barriers to getting around.

We worked with community members to identify where mobility improvements were needed most.


