

KING ROAD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

- Build a 10-foot-wide multi-use path on both sides of King Road.
- Repave King Road between 43rd Avenue and Linwood Avenue.
- Update curb ramps at each intersection to current ADA standards.
- Remove a duplicate water mainline pipe on King Road between 52nd Avenue and Stanley Avenue that is no longer in use.

All work will be done in the city's public right-of-way, not on private property.

Project design continues through April 2024 with construction expected to run from summer 2024 to fall 2025. The city will host an open house later this year to share design updates and provide a chance for community members to share feedback.

This project will repave the road and create improved connections for pedestrians and bicyclists. Multi-use paths will be built along King Road that connect to the recently-completed multi-use paths on 43rd and Linwood Avenues.
