



Summary of Community Comments from the last Open House:

- Children need to have their own distinct, fun area that is separated from other parts of the library to avoid disruption so that they have the freedom to play and be noisy.
- Teens need a separate space that has different types of seating that encourage collaboration, comfortable reading, playing video or board games or just hanging out.
- Space for reading should be cosy, warm and have natural light and views to the landscape beyond.
- Include reservable separate meeting / study rooms for tudoring, book clubs, work groups etc.
- Include an Expandable community room that can adapt to different needs and sizes of events.
- Include a Hands-on learning area for arts, crafts, repair and classes.
- Include as much parking as possible and better bike parking.
- Preserve and celebrate the trees!
- Incorporate local art

Floor Plan Evolution










River Bend Plan Diagram











Floor Plan Option 1 Courtyard





Floor Plan Option 2 Children in the park; Community Meeting streetside





