Staff Picks: Groundhog's Day Edition



In the classic film, *Groundhog Day*, Bill Murray plays a cynical weather man who relives the same day over and over with hilarious complications. It got me thinking about movies in our life that we can watch time after time and still enjoy. So I asked the brilliant and cultured staff here at Ledding Library for some of their favorite films for multiple viewings. Here's a few of our suggestions:

The Princess Bride (1987): Several employees said this was their goto movie and it's easy to see why; adventure, love, sword play, mythical creatures and a beautifully written script by William Golding who also

penned the book. An enduring classic for the whole family.

When Harry Met Sally (1989): With a lively and heartwarming script by Nora Ephron, and great chemistry between the leads, Meg Ryan and Billy Crystal, this is a perennial favorite. It also features a terrific performance by the late, great Carrie Fisher.

Amelie (2001): After being raised with little social contact, naïve and innocent Amelie (Audrey Tatou) creates her own world of dreams and justice. This charming love story begs to be seen more than once.

The Right Stuff (1983): Based on Tom Wolfe's bestselling book, this film recounts the history of the U.S. space program and the Mercury 7 astronauts. A thrilling, dramatic and funny gem.

Casablanca (1942): Bogart, Bergman, a brilliant script and superb direction by Michael Curtiz equal a film that's never dated. Rick (Humphrey Bogart) plays a cynical expatriate who unexpectedly meets up with his lost love Ilsa (Ingrid Bergman) during wartime in Morocco. It's required viewing for Valentine's Day.

The Shawshank Redemption (1994): A man imprisoned for a crime he did not commit finds solace through his friendship with a hardened lifer named Red. This superb film, based on a story by Stephen King, never disappoints.

Monty Python and the Holy Grail (1975): And now for something completely different. This uproarious satire of royalty and religion entertains with one sight gag after another. The British comedy team of Monty Python turns King Arthur on his head.

Also worth mentioning: Rushmore, Gone with The Wind, It's Complicated, The Star Wars saga (all of them), An Affair to Remember, The Sound of Music, Harvey, Anne of Green Gables and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.

So enjoy a beloved film from your Clackamas County Library today. Thanks to Wiley Hickson for the idea for this article.
