A bright spot in our fundraising endeavors were the "Pop-up" Plant Sales. Although the Annual Plant Sale, as





They left plants out on their driveways and allowed passersby to shop and leave money in a jar. We ended up making over \$2,100!








Children's Programs

Summer Reading

FOLL paid for 2,298 giveaway books for summer reading participants. Typically, the library gives one free book to every child and teen who signs up for summer reading, whether at the library or off site. This summer, the library gave free books (purchased by FOLL) to the kids/teens who came to the free sack lunch and grab & go craft bags in the park next to the library on Thursdays, as well as the kids/teens who completed their reading logs and turned them in for prizes. The library also gave books to kids at the 6 Milwaukie free summer lunch sites and in the N. Clackamas Schools summer CARE program, with additional support from the Ready to Read Grant.





FOLL also paid for gift certificates for the teen summer reading program. This year that was limited to the teens who entered monthly online challenges. 4 different teens each won \$25 gift cards from the Friends for submitting entries.

Craft Bags Supplies

The children's library found the Grab & Go Craft Bags to be the most successful form of programming in COVID times and are now making 160 craft bags per week. Last summer, the library gave away 100 bags per week at the weekly free sack lunch/free book in the park events. This fall, they have been making 80 story time bags for younger kids on Tuesdays, and 80 bags for school-age kids on Saturdays. They made 150 for Halloween and again in December for a winter solstice snowman card. The supplies needed to make these bags are adding up, so the children's library needs the Friends' support to continue at the current level.

Just in case there was any doubt over there inside the library, your craft bags were very popular with many kids and many parents!

Thank you and we are looking forward to your great ideas in January 2021!

Kids Book Bundles

During the 2-1/2 weeks that the lobby was open and patrons could grab books in the Community Room, the children's library created **267** bundles of children's books for check out. (In normal times, they make approximately 100 bundles per month.)


More Children's Programs!

FOLL paid for many other youth-related programs in 2020. Before the library closed for COVID, the Friends paid for:

- a monthly LEGO club
- a baby sing & sign program
- a preschool stretch-dance-play program
- 2 Spanish story times

After the COVID shutdown, the Friends funds paid for:

- an online My Gym Happy Valley class for kids at home
- 4 LEGO Club videos that kids could view for 2 weeks each month
- Summer Performances

COVID-19 safety measures brought about a massive amount of change and readjustment for the library. The incredible staff adapted quickly and were able to serve patrons through limited openings and no-contact times.

The incredible circulation numbers can prove it. As of November, 1.2 million items have circulated through the Clackamas County Library System!

Before I say anything else, I want to acknowledge the Friends of Ledding Library for being the most supportive volunteer group I have ever had the privilege of working with. They are people that have come together for one purpose – to support our library.

And they do this in so many ways. They volunteer at the library. They do a Plant Sale every May. They hold a Book Sale every June. They work at the Sunday Market from the beginning of May through the end of October. They pick up donations of materials from all over the area, then sort, price, sell. They set up a Bookstore in the library that is welcoming with affordable purchases for everyone including books, socks from Milwaukie's Sock It To Me, and library swag of t-shirts, canvas bags, mugs, sweatshirts, all promoting the Ledding Library.
