#### **Report: Annual Meeting**

In addition to planning for 2018, a major accomplishment of the Annual Meeting was the adoption of **Revised By-laws** for the Friends of Ledding Library (FOLL). Most of the changes were minor editing corrections. However, the "Purpose" clause was rewritten to better express the objectives and focus of FOLL:

- FOLL shall be an association of people advocating for excellent library services, thereby enhancing the literary, informational, educational, recreational and cultural opportunities available to the Ledding Library of Milwaukie (LLOM) community.
- FOLL shall raise supplementary funding for the LLOM so that the library can provide materials and programming that are beyond the scope of the ordinary library budget.

The **Plant Sale** still needs a volunteer coordinator or team of co-coordinators in order to happen. If it does, it will likely occur the second weekend in May (Mothers' Day weekend). However, during this transition year, the Plant Sale may be affected in ways we can't yet anticipate.

The **Annual Book Sale** will take place the 3rd weekend in June in the Waldorf School Gym. Discussion followed regarding changes in how unsold books are handled. It was noted that First Friday and Sunday Market book sales will be sharing the City Hall Fire Bay with ArtMOB.

FOLL needs someone to **Move Donated Books** from the Library to Harvey Street once a week. An additional source of donated books was mentioned. Possible ways

to best deal with the few uncommon and valuable books that are donated over time will be investigated.

Steps are being taken to allow FOLL to Process Credit Cards at all Book and Plant Sale events. A smart phone has been donated to minimize FOLL's costs for this.

Discussed the Annual Volunteer Brunch; planning is on hold, while the timing of other projects is finalized.

The following Slate of Officers were Elected: Sandy Armstrong (President), Nikki Hoff (Vice President). Salli Slaughter (Secretary), Joe Sandfort and Nancy Wittig (co-Treasurers).

#### Ins and Outs -- A Cash Flow Storv

The recent year continued the Friends of Ledding Library's remarkably stable growth. In one respect, 2017 was also unusual: FOLL received a one time bequest, as well as a one-time insurance payment (from the 'loss of business' due to the accident that closed the Pond House Book Store). These more than doubled FOLL's "income" over the previous year. But even without those unexpected monies, FOLL was able to provide substantial support to the Library and community in the form of enhanced programs and collection acquisitions. And with our recent history, FOLL has pledged over \$50,000 in support to the Library for more programs, activities and collection enhancement for 2018.
