

ORDINANCE NO. 379

AN ORDINANCE providing for a special election to be held on the 28th day of June, 1937, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie, Oregon, for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to amend the charter of Milwaukie filed in the office of the Secretary of State on February 11, 1905, and to amend all acts amending said act by adding thereto Section 22-C authorizing the issuance and sale of Seventeen thousand dollars (\$17,000.00) General Obligation Bonds of said City of Milwaukie to provide funds with which to erect, construct, build and furnish a City Hall, and providing for the levy of a special tax to pay principal and interest on said bonds.

MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That a special election be held on the 28th day of June, 1937, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection of the following proposal:

AN ACT

To amend an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the Town of Milwaukie in Clackamas County, Oregon, and to repeal all acts and parts of acts in conflict therewith, to-wit, 'An Act to incorporate the Town of Milwaukie in Clackamas County, Oregon,' passed by the Twenty-second Regular Session of the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon and approved by the Governor on February 4, 1903" passed by the Twenty-third Regular Session of the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon and filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1905, as amended by amendments to said Act adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by the people of the people by adding thereto Section 22-C to read as follows:-

"Section 22-C (a) for the purpose of procuring funds with which to erect, construct, build and furnish a City Hall, the Council of Milwaukie is authorized and empowered to issue and sell general obligation bonds of said Milwaukie in the amount of Seventeen thousand dollars (\$17,000.00) said bonds to be in denominations of Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and duly signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder, whereby said Milwaukie shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and pay to the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum named therein in lawful money of the United States of America, with interest thereon in like lawful money at the rate of not to exceed five per cent (5%) per annum, payable semiannually, each of said bonds to be a direct general obligation of Milwaukie, Oregon, said bonds to be issued at a convenient time to be fixed by the Council, maturity or maturities to be likewise determined by the Council, all of said bonds, however long they may mature within seventeen years, said bonds to be known as 'Milwaukie City Hall Bonds', which bonds shall be sold by the City Council as in and to the effect of the following provisions, and the Council in its discretion and judgment may be best.

(b) It shall be the duty of the Treasurer of Milwaukie to see that the proceeds of the sale of said bonds be deposited in the City Treasury and used for the purposes herein provided.
