1. TSP OVERVIEW

- Identifies transportation goals/policies
- Inventories transportation assets/deficiencies
- Is future-oriented, i.e., what will we need in 20 years?
- Identifies and prioritizes projects

- Must be consistent with regional and state rules.
- Is required for state/federal funding

1. TSP OBJECTIVES

- Identify and address the range of needs and preferences in historically underrepresented groups
- Remove barriers to equitable outcomes for all community members
- Engage with Neighborhood District Associations, community members, business owners, first responders, and other civic groups to receive input in developing the updated TSP



1. TSP OBJECTIVES

- Make City streets safe for everyone
- Design, implement and maintain a balanced and multimodal transportation system with an emphasis on pedestrians, cyclists, and transit use
- Reduce VMT and greenhouse gas emissions
- Respond to population growth, evolving land use patterns, revised state statues, and identified community priorities
- Identify a flexible and implementable funding strategy

- 0.9 2.3% speak English less than "very well" (Smaller than statewide share about 5.3%)
- Youth and Seniors = 1/3 population (Like state and county with MOE)
- **11.6 15.8% of Milwaikians live with a disability (Smaller than statewide share about 9.8%)**
- **3.0– 6.2%** Foreign Born (Smaller than statewide share about 9.8%)
- 2% of couple households are same-sex (Greater than the county and state share 1% and 1.3%)



- 37.8-45% Renter Occupied Households (Like the state and higher than the county about 29%)
- 5.4 8.2% Living Below Poverty Level (Smaller than statewide share about 12.1%)
- **\$78k** Median Household Income (Less than the county median about \$95k and lower than comparable Portland Metro Cities).
- 8.3 % Single Parent Households (3/4 female-headed, like state and county share).
- 360 Houseless Community Members in January 2023 (Likely an undercount)








20-Year Forecast (2023 Dollars)
