Monthly Report, Ledding Library, Milwaukie, OR – April 2024

Director

April was a busy, and in a lot of ways, consequential month.

In April, the City of Milwaukie's City Manager left the city for a new position in Washington County, and The Chief of Police retired. The leadership of the city is in good hands, but nonetheless, these changes had impact on some of my work. It required me to shift some of my focus from the library to my role as as a member of the City's executive team.

I had the privlidge of serving on the bargaining team (on the management side) as we worked through negotiations for AFSCME. I enjoyed working through this process, and the two, half-day sessions in the month represent a big time commitment.

April (into May) also represented major steps forward for the library's strategic plan. The road map of where we're going is becoming more clear. I met with the library board and some staff, to discuss our future, while incorporating the city's strategic plan and our role as library within Clackamas County. I met with our consultant, to incorporate the board's feedback from our Library Board work session, to prepare additional feedback from library staff on our staff development day on May 1st. With staff input from May 1st, and incorporating asyncroncis comments from staff since then, I'll bring a revised draft for the Library Board to provide additional feedback at our May Meeting. By June, we'll aim to finalize the Strategic Plan with the Library Board. Finally, I'll then bring it to Council for their input.

Supporting Staff

Nicole attended the Public Library Association conference in Columbus, OH. This was Nicole's first time to attend a national library conference. She attended numerous sessions and learned more about Intellectual Freedom, Bookmobiles, and book lockers.

Library staff (Brent, Fida, Jan, Jana, Kelly, Sara, Tasha & Lucy) attended the Oregon Library Association annual conference in Salem.

Alex began a 6 Month online BOLI (Bureau of Labor & Industries) course to learn more about human resources and management.

The library team welcomed 23 of our City coworkers and 28 kids to the library where attendees learned about working in the library, a scavenger hunt, and button-making activity on Bring Your Child to Work Day – April 25.

Helping Milwaukians Most in Need

In May, the library will begin a new way of recording how library patrons are connecting with community partners for social services. This will include both how often staff are referring folks to our patners, and how often our partners are connecting with Milwaukians most in need.

In April, staff recorded 6 Social Service referrals in PITS. Staff provided water and granola bars to 68 patrons during the month.

Adult Services Updates & Programs

Brent met with Cierra Cook (owner of Spoke & Word) to discuss possible future collaboration opportunities. Moving forward when authors want a a bookseller onsite to sell their books, the library will partner with Spoke & Word to offer that service. Additionally, Cierra met with the Adult Services team to talk about other possible future colloborations.

Spring Open Mic - local writers performed spoken word poetry and an Open Mic followed. Milwaukie Poetry Series also hosted poet Donna Henderson, who engaged an audience of 30 poetry enthusiasts.

Visiting author Andrew Leland gave a talk on Sunday, April 28. He discussed his book *The Country of the Blind: A Memoir at the End of Sight*, which is part personal memoir, part investigation of the history & culture of blindness. Andrew's book came out last year and was listed as a Best Book of the Year by *The Washington Post*, *NPR*, *New York Times Magazine* and numerous other media outlets.



Our community partner Spoke & Word was onsite and sold 10 copies of the book.

It was a joyful occasion with 30 reading enthusiasts in attendance. Additionally, a group of 7 City of Milwaukie staff members met during lunch to discuss the book. This was the first session of the occasional, very casual Team Milwaukie Book Club.

Youth Services Programming

The Friends of Ledding Library sponsored three youth programs this month: a baby sing, sign & play class, LEGO Club, and Spanish storytime. We appreciate their year-round generous support!

Book Buddies – the book group for ages 7-9 – celebrated the final meeting of the school year with a voting party. Kids helped select the winner of this year's Beverly Clearly Children's Choice Award.

April also included the final Little Comics grab & go bags full of book-related activities and the Oregon Readers' Choice Award (ORCA) book group of the school year.

Kids and their grownups enjoyed Wonka on the big screen at this month's Family Movie Matinee.

<u>Circulation Services Highlights</u>

Kelly provided training for 5 new On-Call LA1s. Please welcome Desiree, Emma, Joelle, Lily, and Tor. They all attended a 4 hour introductory training session and then completed 8 additional training hours of shadowing. The new hires have already started filling in for vacations and absences. We are very happy to have them on our circulation team. We will welcome Simon, another new hire to the On-Call LA1s in June.

IRCO interns, Dani and Guadalupe, participated in a full shadow day at the library and observed work at all of the service points throughout the library. They will begin their internship in May and complete 160 hours each of job training. Their library work will include shelving, assisting with collection management, special projects, and learning more about library services and other city departments through tours, job shadows, and trainings.
