Michael Read, WES Interim Director, returned with an update on repairs at Kellogg Waste Treatment Plant.

- Replacement of the air diffuser is $\frac{3}{4}$ done.
- Upgrade on the clarifier is a future project.
- New outfall diffuser which puts clean water into the river will be done next year.
- A de-watering facility which removes water from solid is needed. This is a future project.

Katie Newell City updates.

- Leaf drop dates are November 1st, 15th, 22nd & December 6th & 13th from 7am to 2pm. Residents must bring a copy of City utility bill to participate. Residents are also encouraged to bring a donation to the food bank. More information is available on the City's website.
- North Clackamas Parks & Recreation District and the City of Milwaukie are partnering to plan and develop four neighbor parks. Community members are invited to a series of visioning meetings. Citizen's input will help shape the concepts for the future parks. Good Neighbor Committee (GNC) update by Dion Shepard.

- Tree removal phase was discussed at length. Top priority is to inform the public of the process and why trees and scrubs will be removed which will expose the treatment plant. Open house, informational signs, Pilot edition, and Clackamas Revue will help to inform the public.
- Planting plan is schedule for November and December 2014.
- GNC funding will be over budget. The committee will go to the City Council to ask for additional monies.

- As of September 30, 2014 the bank balance is \$12,165.82.
- Expenses still out are picnic expenses and sign toppers installation.
