The meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m.

Dave asked if everyone had reviewed the minutes from the last meeting. Kim made a motion to approve the minutes. Don seconded the motion. Agreed unanimously.

Chief – there was a discussion regarding a recent shooting in the Island Station area. The first officer arrived at the scene within one minute of receiving the call. The Code Red system was used to notify neighbors. The Clackamas County SWAT team was called out. We have one officer on the team. There was a Clackamas County boat and two K-9 units also. The railroad tracks were temporarily closed and there were LOPD officers on the railroad tracks as part of the perimeter. There was an aviation unit with an infrared scanner used. The suspect was found hiding under a tarp on Elk Rock Island and he was taken into custody without further incident. It was a very successful operation. The Code Red system did not notify all the neighbors. Chief asked City Hall to encourage residents to register on the City's website for the system. This information will be in the Pilot soon. Ray suggested that bringing this up once a year at NDS meetings should be put into PSAC's work plan. Mary wanted to know if all members of the PSAC could be notified each time there is a notification. The Chief said he could see that that happens – or he could send a text. Some of the members do not want to be notified.

Ulli Neitch is our new PIO officer.

We have researched with the City of Gresham regarding the drug turn-in program to see what they've done. We have our own plan. Saturday, April 10th is a tentative date to host our own event. Providence Milwaukie Hospital has agreed to help with the disposal. It was decided to separate the shredding project from this project to avoid confusion.

Ryan Burdick will be promoted to Sergeant on February 9th. We have switched to a four 10-hour day shift now. We're going to try it for a year and if it doesn't cost us any more money we'll stay with it.

The Ardenwald neighborhood has had some issues regarding traffic on JCB. We have done two traffic surveys recently. The speed varies. The Chief does not know if traffic lights will improve the situation or not. He feels this is an engineering issue and not a police issue.

Ray – Light rail update – they've finished the 25% engineering so they can go back and look at the budget and reevaluate the costs. Traffic information was the main focus of the last Milwaukie meeting. The traffic engineer said the only intersections that will need changes are McLoughlin and Washington, Harrison, and Main Street. The City's liaison will be happy to come and address the PSAC and answer any questions. Ray said there is an electronic document coming out soon regarding the design. He will forward that to PSAC members when he gets it. The next Milwaukie meeting will be February 22nd at Bridge City Church and then an open house on the 25th at MHS.

Brad – NTMPSP update – he didn't have any updates so he asked if anyone had questions. Dave asked about the speed reduction request on Railroad. Brad isn't sure if Brenda did the traffic study yet – he'll check and email members. Don asked about repainting the intersection of 42nd & King. Brad will check into that.

Officer of the Year Dinner – the American Legion will cover the costs of the awards. They've offered their facilities for the event. The date has been set for March 18th at 6:00p.m. and dinner served at 7:00 p.m. There will be a buffet with a choice of beef or salmon. The cost will be \$15 per person. The Foundation has received pledges for funds for the dinner. There was a discussion regarding whom to give free dinners to. Kim made a motion that we do not provide free tickets to folks who donate funds. Mary seconded the motion. Passed unanimously. The award recipients will receive two free tickets. Dave suggested providing 20 free tickets for members of the Department. It was decided not to include the Fire District in the event.

Linda Hedges –Milwaukie Emergency Preparedness Network proposal – Linda gave background on the project. She would like each neighborhood to have one or two designated sights where people can go in case of emergency and include this information in a brochure. She asked that each member go back to their NDA and designate at least one shelter sight. The Red Cross has already designated some sights. She also wants to gather information on resources and needs in the neighborhoods (i.e.: chainsaws, transportation, someone on dialysis, etc.) to create a network of citizens and resources. There was a discussion regarding confidentiality. She would like to have a group of individuals continue with the SERT training. They are having an Emergency Preparedness meeting on February 18th at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall. Mary made a motion for PSAC to support the development of a Milwaukie Emergency Preparedness Network. Susanna seconded the motion. Don and Pepi abstained. It was approved by the remaining members.

The Chief said there will be a cyber safety presentation at the High School on February 8th at 7:00 p.m.

Dolly shared a door hanger that she received recently.

The recent landlord training had a very good turnout. Sgt. Foreman did a presentation. Jag will be attending the Boy Scout flag-raising ceremony at the Pioneer Cemetery on Memorial Day at 8:30 a.m.

Chief said that Scott Huteson was injured recently on a track with Jag outside the City. Scott is on crutches. We have two other officers on light duty.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:25 PM
