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II. REPORTS:

A. Clackamas County Fire Report-Jack Tanz

- October is fire prevention month
- Have notification devices in each room, and carbon monoxide detectors in each floor of the room
- Use the back of the hand to check for heat before opening doors
- New 10 year smoke alarm the battery is not replaceable
- Operation Santa-end of November/beginning of December—If there is a parade, will NOT be collecting during the parade, but rather at a static site (more details to follow on Clackamas fire website)
- City of Gladstone is looking for a full contract for service, and if this goes through, then their personal and equipment would become part of Clackamas fire
- Remember safety on Halloween-use reflective gear and watch out for little ones—encouraged to wear safety masks
- Plaid Electric over on 82nd still has many smoke alarms if people are looking.

B. Milwaukie Police Report-Robbie Graves

- Still working through the body cam process—have identified a vendor; should be online between now and July
- One officer gave notice today-worked with department 17 years
- Coming up in November-Officer David McVay effected arrest that will grant him the “life saving award” representing Milwaukie
- September 30th-coffee with a cop event that had good reception
- Citation numbers have gone up
- Question regarding speed racing-there has been an “uptick” in bad driving
- Now a records person in background department

C. NDA Concerns

- Ardenwald- concern regarding 37th & Harrison curve that acts as a hazard; suggestion to remove bush next to right-of-way; police will followup to see if there is an option to address.

- Lake Road-Last month there was concern regarding paint near Edison at 224 and Lake; some paint has been put back—However, there are local residents concerned about the safety walking up and down hill to Rowe Middle School- Interest In getting some traffic control in this are. — TSP committee will be looking at these issues.
- The Stake Holders’ meeting at the start of next year will take up this discussion.
- Public works has put out paint-Steve Adams will check in with Peter (public works director) to see what the solution regarding the re-striping that was left undone.
- Likely will have a consultant on board for TSP in May
- Lewelling- Traffic committee meets every week and will present data on their survey at their next meeting—NDA will release survey results by end of month/beginning of November
- Linwood-per the original design,—yes, pathway on Linwood is pervious pavement.
- Monroe to Johnson creek-90% plan set on Wednesday-out to bid in Winter (February) May 2022 is tentative start-18 month project to be finished by fall of 2023.
- The sidewalks go up by Safeway/42/43?-contractor is hired, project manager is waiting for traffic control plans; expect to have mid November to start. **Meeting on November 3rd on corner of 43rd and Howe-informal question and answer get together 5:30-6:30**
- Panels are loose at railroad/harmony/lake—panels around track wobble-who do we talk to about these? From lake onto harmony, panel most on lake side of track-Union pacific railroad owns crossing; Looking to redo railroad crossing on Harrison, Oak, Harmony—email in May-Maybe in 2022
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#### D. Capital Improvement Plan Projects-Steve Adams

- Linwood is close-pavement and pathway are down
- A couple of curbs and gutters that need to be replace; trees are out
- Will need a dry day to paint on
- Diverter needs a special cover that protects the “man-hole” so its not a safety hazard
- Lake road is almost done-looking at mid November
- Will stripe Lake Rd when all the lanes are available
- Got the bids in on Wednesday for Home and Wood—Came in at \$3 Million. Expect to go to counsel in winter to approve-Kerr contracting was awarded the bid
- Apartments at 37th and Monroe mobilized this week
- 33rd and Roswell- coming along
- 32nd and Oleson-close to wrapping up
- Just got Henley Place Plans-176 unit apartment-(going on the old Kellog Bowl) on north end of Main
- Coho Point on Washington was approved in late September.
- Corner of Washington and 23rd—Plan to demolish white house and build 50 or so unit affordable housing
- 107 unit by North Clackamas Park—Started in Fall of 2019; Had been delayed over charges; They are coming back and hope to go forward to build the senior living center there in the corner of Milwaukie
- 37th and Monroe project—eventually the 37th-Linwood on railroad path will be part of the TSP
- Concern about the cars that are parked on the Linwood pathway—Police have been reluctant to reinforce during construction.—Only several homes that are repeat violators at this point
- In the event of an emergency-for people who do not have transpiration, what is the plan to ensure that everyone will be able to leave safely in the event of an emergency?

### IV. DISCUSSION

#### A. Transportation System Plan

- The goal stated on the website of Milwaukie for 2013 plan: Provide access and affordable transportation for all Milwaukie residence
- Protecting Neighborhoods from cut through traffic;6 foot diameter circles popular in SE Portland—Make it difficult for trucks and busses to turn—Conversation for Stake Holders
- Current diverters are Monroe and Linwood and Monroe and 224 when ODOT builds
- Process for being a part of the TSP is to be elected by the NDA-one or two members from each NDA;Looking for some business groups as well as representatives from police, fire, and hospital—
- Next couple months Steve will put together a more formal process to have around 20 people on the TSP committee—
- Per state law, all public meetings require a zoom option.
- Earliest for an in person meeting would be January
