2. Public Comment

- a. Nicole Perry updated the K-12 poster contest deadline has been shifted to June 1st.

3. Reports

- a. Ben Green- Ride to Own Program will begin in May (not a city program)
- b. Ann Ober- Houseless Services Update
 - i. 2 out of 5 grant requests were funded, including \$30K for 3yrs for a cooling center at the Ledding Library.
 - ii. \$450K funded for N. Clackamas Service Center- located at the back of Fred Meyer/82nd- this provides rent and food assistance
 - iii. The Episcopal Church on main is interested in creating an emergency shelter. They are partnering with the city to write a grant. They need funding to update bathrooms and create separation from childcare.
 - iv. The construction is funded (\$4M) for a County facility is a 23hr stabilization center next to Goodwill and OLCC. The front half will be 20 spots as a place for someone to “take a breath” when in crisis. The back half will be 30-60 beds. The funding for a staff member there did not come through but hopefully it will be covered in a different overall funding package.
 - v. BOB (Better Outcomes thru Bridges) program at Providence- the hospital has agreed to have a social worker on site from 7pm-5am
- c. Jack Tanz- Attached fire report. No questions
- d. Tony Cereghino- Police Department
 - i. Tents on Trolley Trail- Glen, Don and LoveOne are working together to find a place for the individuals- hoping to have a change in the next week
 - ii. Human trafficking mission held on 2/28- arrested 2 traffickers
 - iii. Chief Ryan will be sworn in
 - iv. Tony will move to Chief Operations
 - v. 4/27 Shred event: pill disposal
 - vi. 4/30 Brian Johnson will be celebrated as Police Officer of the Year @ Elks Lodge at 6:30

4. Capital Improvement Projects

- a. Working on pond at the end of Balfour
- b. Hillside Apartments- phase 1 will start next month- largely demolition. Once completed it will triple the amount of units.
- c. Ardenworld North- final phase of design. Construction anticipated for summer 2025
- d. Harvey Street- community feedback will be requested between end of April to early July
- e. East Monroe Greenway- surveyors on site-working. Keep an eye out for mailers for community feedback. Developing a working group of community stakeholders.
- f. King Rd- 60% Stormwater design
- g. Washington St Improvement- just started
- h. Spring Creek- 27th Ave. and Washington St.- Culvert work to correct design flaws to prevent flooding
- i. Waverly Heights- Still in design phase. Sewer redesign. Open house in early May.
- j. Waverly South- repaving off Lake/26th Ave.
- k. 2024 Grind and Pave- Design is almost complete. 2x more than last year. City aiming to start in mid-June. The city will send out mailers a few weeks before and door-hangers 10 days prior to construction. The roads are essentially closed during the process.
- l. Crack and slurry seal project: this is a cheaper way to lengthen the lifespan of street that is less degraded. Map and schedule provided at meeting.

5. NDA Concerns

- a. Pam with Island Station: a two-way green light near 99 & River Rd

6. Discussion-

- a. Results of March 5th Council Meeting- Members voiced their feelings of disappointment over the decision and that there should be more give from the city. Many community members voiced concern over the issue and there should be more collaboration and transparency. City reps responded with an agreement that something to alert cars of the greenway is needed. Yet, it will most likely be road painting and not signage. They explained there is a limited budget and resources. Money would be coming out of SPOT and not SAFE, since that is funding for sidewalks and trails.
- b. Heat Maps- City reps presented an internal document that pictured the last 3 years of bike accidents and bike/car collisions as dots along a map of the city. This map showed 29th St to be a low incidence area. City reps are hoping to make these maps a part of PSAC meetings on a more regular basis.
- c. SPOT Program- A resident proposal program. SPOT is essentially a pot of money (\$350K) that will pay for small improvements based on community requests.
