- II. REPORTS

A. Clackamas County Fire Report —Jack Tan
Nearly 2500 calls for service in July (majority is EMS)
Fire season is still in effect so be cautious around fire usage.
Sat 9/10/22 10-2 pm hilltop fair—
-several station open houses in October
-September is Emergency preparedness moth (evacuation plan, emergency supplies, go bag for 72 hours)
-texting is much more efficient than voice when using cell phones
-river temps are running 73-74 degrees temp in PDX
-8/26/22 will see many hood to coast runners along Johnson creek
-9k for k9 will be on 8/27/22

B. Milwaukie Police Report Captain Graves

-prescription drug events and paper shred are heavily dependent on Milwaukie CERT -6 officers have been deployed to test the body worn cameras—Most officers will be wearing those every day

-Drone program is up and running. First deploying was when there was a random shooting in downtown Milwaukie

-Human traffic training-officers have been trained by Human Compass (gave Milwaukie great praise for leading charge in addressing human trafficking)

-been meeting with schools and colleges regarding emergency response as result of concerns from shooting in Uvaldi Texas Shooting

-staffing and hiring issues are relatively common in the industry.

-project Hope works with drug addicts

C. NDA Concerns PSAC Members

-Island Station-the traffic concerns on River and 22nd—Traffic Counter on 22nd was recently put in place by Chris Ben.

-hoping for speed bumps or thin elevated strips (also looking at a slowdown flashing arrow with solar panel on top that charges) that would be at 22nd and Sparrow

-Lake Road-striping on 37th (wondering if it will come back?)

-Hector/Cambell—greenway intersection of Washington and 37th —Monroe apartments are to build new ADA ramp and both east and west side as well as striped crosswalk

-Monroe apartments are scheduled to be done in Spring of 2023

-Street improvements are to be done in October

-Either tied to Monroe greenway or TSP—railroad intersection on 37th will be reworked to reduce congestion

-Linwood—concerns about maintenance of pathway on Linwood—D&D contractor is responsible replacing trees if More than 12 die within 2 years. They are also responsible for the landscaped between space—Limb clearance and path upkeep will be public works responsibility

-PSAC is interested in possibly helping out clean up some of the neighborhood/streets that do cleanup

-Jason Wachs has been the point of contact to supply buckets and cleanup

-Lewelling-focus has been on concerts and Carefree funding-

- \$92 million for state of Oregon for Safe routes to school programming in the next 5 years. -approximately \$750K Grant from safe routes to school looking—starting on project identification planning for Lewelling for grant received

-Construction Grant that comes out of that is \$2 million for safety upgrades

-Home-was concerned about shooting-not really much information on it

-Ardenwald- Cross street of Balfore and Sherrit-(Sharrows have been started)

-Looking for scope of work to do traffic counts and look formally at the street to provide suggestions as part of a central Milwaukie bike order plan—should have info in November -transportation survey done in the first 6 month of year (report sent to Steve Adams and Jay)

-King Road from 32nd-40th is in bad shape for bicycles.

D. Capital Improvement Plan Projects Steve Adams

-Along with the \$4 million grant, ODOT is pledging \$ for Monroe greenway—Most paperwork is done—City has requested proposals for design consultant

--Monroe greenway is broken into 5 phases (segments)—can be found on city of Milwaukie webpage

-City will need to tie into the improvements made by ODOT

-3 of the 5 phases are fun

-TSP—final stages of scope of work for tsp—once this is done, needs to go through Oregon DOJ—Once scope of work is approved we will be meeting regularly

-city is working to redesign King (42nd - Wichita)

—Stanley is in need of sidewalks (monroe to King)

—43rd project is mostly done (gab down by Howe)

—Home/wood—a couple ADA ramps have been installed; been repaved including driveway

connection; completion between railroad and monroe; will be grinding asphalt between monroe and King;

—Mid to late September will be paving

—Ardenwald North—recent public open house;

—Utility upgrades on Washington street (open house on Wednesday the 14th)

—Harvey street from 32nd-42nd (sidewalk will be added) currently on back burner designed through 2023 and developed in 20224

-Eklrock estates are going to start building soon

-Ardenwald on 33rd and Roswell are hoping to finish curb and pave in September

-Waverly crt improvements will happen in September/October

-Review of plans on 8 plot subdivision on Home/Harrison-construction might start in spring

—Henley place downtown for Historic Milwaukie have all demo work done—permits to take trees down (old Kellogg bowl site)
